Curious Jac is on at Riverside Theatres in Parramatta.
There are signs out the front saying 'Riverside'.



There are sliding doors going into the foyer.

is sitting in.



When the show starts, it will be time to be quiet and listen. The lights will turn
down a little bit, but – don't worry - it will not get too dark.

Curious Jac is a theatre show. There will be people onstage telling a story.



There is Lilli. She will tell the story of Curious Jac .
And she will use music , puppets and your imagination to help her.



The two main characters in the story are Curious Jac and the time eagle.



On stage there will also be musicians to help Lilli tell the story.

There will be Ann. She plays lots of different instruments. She plays the guitar,



and the Classical Indian Guitar.

Kaija will be on stage, too. She will be singing and playing cello.



Jiah is 15 years old. He will be playing the trumpet.



Nicola is 13. She plays the flute.



Lilli will ask some people to come onstage and help her, but you don't have to.



She will ask for help with two stories. The first story is how turtle got the cracks on his back.

Lilli will also ask for help during the story about Anansi the spider.



Anansi the spider is a beanbag that has had arms sewn onto it to help the beanbag look like a spider.

When the show is finished, people will clap their hands.

This is to thank the performers. You can clap too if you want to, or if it is too loud, you can put your hands over your ears.



When the performance is finished and it is time to go, you will leave Riverside.
You will leave through the sliding doors again.
